It was intended as a compilation of all of the main theological teachings of his time, covering the widest range of subjects - reason, sin, just war to name but a few - in detailed philosophical language. Aquinas worked on it from 1265 until the end of his life in March 1274. When he died, he had reached Question ninety of Part III, on the subject of penance. Part 1 deals with foundational questions about the nature and character of God, structured as a series of questions and assertions.

"The *Summa Theologica* is the best-known work of Italian philosopher, scholar, and Dominican friar SAINT THOMAS AQUINAS (1225-1274), widely considered the Catholic Church's greatest theologian. Famously consulted (immediately after the Bible) on religious questions at the Council

of Trent, Aquinas's masterpiece has been considered a summary of official Church philosophy ever since. Aquinas considers approximately 10,000 questions on Church doctrine covering the roles and nature of God, man, and Jesus, then lays out objections to Church teachings and systematically confronts each, using Biblical verses, theologians, and philosophers to bolster his arguments. In Volume I, Aquinas addresses: the existence and perfection of God the justice and mercy of God predestination the cause of evil the union of body and soul free will and fate and much more. This massive work of scholarship, spanning five volumes, addresses just about every possible query or argument that any believer or atheist could have, and remains essential, more than seven hundred years after it was written, for clergy, religious historians, and serious students of Catholic thought."

One message given in Anaheim, California, on April 17, 1976. This message is included in this volume under the title *Practical Points for the Sisters concerning the Building Up of the Church*. 5. Five messages given in Anaheim, California, on June 21 through October 20, 1976. These messages are included in this

volume under the title *Living Christ and Contacting People for the Gospel*. 6. Two messages given in Anaheim, California, on June 30 and July 1, 1976. These messages are included in this volume under the title *The Functioning of the Believers to Bring In the Kingdom*. 7. Four messages given in Anaheim, California, on July 11 through October 31, 1976. They are included in this volume under the title *Miscellaneous Messages Given to the Church in Anaheim*. 8. Six messages given in Anaheim, California, on July 11 through November 14, 1976. Two of the messages were combined. The resulting five chapters are included in this volume under the title *Various Anaheim Lord's Day Evening Meetings*. 9. Four messages given in Anaheim, California, on July 29 and 30, 1976. These messages are included in this volume under the title *The Eldership and the Progress of the Church Life*. 10. One message given in Anaheim, California, on October 24, 1976. This message was originally published in a separate booklet entitled *What a Heresy--Two Divine Fathers, Two Life-giving Spirits, and Three Gods!* and is included in this volume under the same title. It was later published together with *The Revelation of the Triune God according to the Pure Word of the Bible* (see *The Collected Works of Witness Lee, 1975-1976, vol. 2*) in a two-chapter book entitled *Contending for the Faith: the Truth concerning the Trinity*. 11. Fourteen messages given in Anaheim, California, on November 1 through 28, 1976. These messages were previously published in fifteen chapters in a book entitled *Young People's Training*. 12. Five messages given in Anaheim, California, on December 21 and 22, 1976. They are included in this volume under the title *The Lord's Present Move and Vision in His Recovery*.

Reinhard Hü tter 's main thesis in this third volume of the *Sacra Doctrina* series is that John Henry Newman, in his own context of the nineteenth century, a century far from being a foreign one to our

own, faced the same challenges as we do today; the problems then and now differ in degree, not in kind. Hence, Newman's engagement with these problems offers us a prescient and indeed prophetic diagnosis of what these problems or errors, if not corrected, will lead to—consequences which have more or less come to pass—and, furthermore, an alternative way which is at once thoroughly Catholic and holds contemporary relevance. The introduction offers a survey of Newman's life and works and each of the subsequent four chapters addresses one significant aspect of Christianity that is not only contested or rejected by secular unbelief, but also has a counterfeit for which not only Christians, but even Catholics have fallen. The counterfeit of conscience is the "conscience" of the sovereign subject (Ch. 1); the counterfeit of faith is the "faith" of one who does not submit to the living authority through which God communicates but rather adheres to the principle of private judgment in matters of revealed religion (Ch. 2); the counterfeit of doctrinal development is twofold: (i) paying lip service to development while only selectively accepting its consequences on the grounds of a specious antiquarianism and (ii) invoking development theory to justify all sorts of contemporary changes according to the present Zeitgeist (Ch. 3). Finally, the counterfeit of the university are all those "universities" whose end is not to educate and thereby to perfect the intellect, but rather to feed more efficiently the empire of desire that is informed by the techno-consumerism of today (Ch. 4). The book concludes with an epilogue on Hü tter's journey to Catholicism.

Summa Theologica Part I (Prima Pars) Thomas Aquinas - The Summa Theologiae (Latin: Compendium of Theology or Theological Compendium; also subsequently called the Summa Theologica or simply the Summa, written 1265-1274) is the best-known work of Thomas Aquinas (c.1225-1274), and although unfinished, "one of the classics of the history of philosophy and one of the most influential works of Western literature." It is intended as a manual for beginners in theology and a compendium of all of the main theological teachings of the Church. It presents the reasoning for almost all points of

Christian theology in the West. The Summa's topics follow a cycle: the existence of God; Creation, Man; Man's purpose; Christ; the Sacraments; and back to God. (courtesy of wikipedia.com). This is part 1, 'Prima Pars'. Aquinas's greatest work was the Summa, and it is the fullest presentation of his views. He worked on it from the time of Clement IV (after 1265) until the end of his life. When he died, he had reached Question 90 of Part III (on the subject of penance). What was lacking was added afterwards from the fourth book of his commentary on the Sentences of Peter Lombard as a supplementum, which is not found in manuscripts of the thirteenth and fourteenth centuries. The Summa was translated into Greek (apparently by Maximus Planudes around 1327), Armenian, many European languages, and Chinese. It consists of three parts. Part I treats of God, who is the "first cause, himself uncaused" (primum movens immobile) and as such existent only in act (actu) - that is, pure actuality without potentiality, and therefore without corporeality. His essence is actus purus et perfectus. This follows from the fivefold proof for the existence of God; namely, there must be a first mover, unmoved, a first cause in the chain of causes, an absolutely necessary being, an absolutely perfect being, and a rational designer.
