poor Southern tobacco farmer
who worked the same land as her
slave ancestors, yet her

HeLa cells were vital for
developing the polio vaccine;

and sold by the billions. Yet
Henrietta Lacks remains virtually
unknown, buried in an

family did not learn of her

twenty years after her death,
when scientists investigating
HeLa began using her husband
and children in research without
informed consent. And though
the cells had launched a
multimillion-dollar industry that
sells human biological materials,
her family never saw any of the
