As the dense coastal fog rolls in to blanket the shoreline in gloomy silence, one thing becomes very clear. Oregon is a state in which ghosts roam. Not only here on the coast but in the lush green inland regions as well. Oregon is the ninth largest state in the US, and is one of contrasts. From the fertile Willamette Valley with its hundreds of wineries to its rugged coastline; from its twenty-two feet tall Pioneer statue, known affectionately as Gold Man, sitting atop the state capital in Salem to its ghost towns, Oregon is a state of stark beauty, hauntings, and history. The Wolf Creek Inn is the oldest continuous use hotels in the state of Oregon. Each room at the hotel is decorated to reflect the early 1900's style. The weary stage coach travelers of the late 1800's that once slept at the inn welcomed the peace, tranquility and food offered at the Inn after an exhausting stage coach ride. Cowboys also frequented the Inn sleeping in the attic and gambling in a room that is now the lobby. A card table and spur marks on the original wood flooring are reminders of these guests. It is in this room where Madonna Merced, Ghost Tracker, completed and EVP, (Electronic Voice Phenomena), session capturing several voices on digital recorder of those who once played the games of chance. During the early days of movies, the Inn became a refuge for beleaguered actors seeking an escape from demanding Hollywood studios. Clark Gable was a good friend of the innkeeper in the 1930s and stopped by

several times while fishing the Rogue River just a few miles west of the Inn. Other visitors that have signed the guest register include Carol Lombard, Mary Pickford and Orson Wells. Madonna captured a full body apparition of a man in the hallway across from the room referred to as the Clark Gable room and then captured EVPs of a woman and child that seemed to follow her down the hallway during the paranormal investigation of the second floor. If you dare to look you will see a most astonishing photograph taken in the attic of a spirit that might just be the ghost of Mary Pickford. The attic was abundant with apparitions and a sound captured on digital recorder that resembles that of spurs being attached to wood. The Wolf Creek Tavern is a beautiful place to visit and occupied from some unusual residents.

Strange accidents, one almost fatal, happened on a regular basis. Figures were seen, both human and otherwise. In one case a house was seen where no house had existed for many, many years. Disturbing personality changes emerged, even resulting in a transformation of eye color from brown to blue. The toll taken on the emotional and physical health of the family soon became too much to endure and they were forced to abandon the house in 1974. Hopefully, this book will cause skeptics to think again to avoid a similar shock to the senses.

The family had a rude awakening. It's never easy finding out that you can't always trust your senses, that nothing is really impossible and that there is a breaking point for everyone. Whether the reader is a died-in-the-wool skeptic, a searcher, a believer or somewhere in between, I hope everyone reads these pages with an open mind. It is all true! *Echoes of a Haunting* has recently been chosen as a textbook for a Masters Degree Program in Parapsychology at Texas Christian University. The Professor teaching the course, Dr. Timothy Barth, has stated that it's the best documented case of a haunting he has ever read. The house is currently being investigated by Paranormal researchers who have taken startling photos of "energy orbs" and strange colored lights in the area.
