A lot has been written about the relationship of the third wave of feminism in the United States to the second wave, yet no one has examined works by young female writers as belonging to the third wave of feminism. Using tools of literary criticism to analyze the literary output of third wave feminism in the United States, *Ungrateful Daughters* looks at the main anthologies of third wave writings, paying attention to their structure, production process and narrative forms used in the individual pieces.
