This trend, combined with social and cultural shifts after the Second World War, laid the foundation for the New World revolution in the 1980s, making Britain into a confirmed country of wine-drinkers and a massive market for New World wines. These New World producers may have only received critical acclaim in the late twentieth century, but *Imperial Wine* shows that they had spent centuries wooing, and indeed manufacturing, a British market for inexpensive colonial wines.
