As the General Motors plant in Lordstown, Ohio halted production and faced possible closure, displacing its workers, artist LaToya Ruby Frazier joined with these workers, their families, and their local union leaders to tell the story of the plant in its final days. After more than fifty years of automobile production and a commitment to manufacture the Chevrolet Cruze until 2021, the facility was recently "unallocated" by GM, as the company shifts its focus toward overseas manufacturing and the production of electric and autonomous vehicles. For many, this meant uprooting their families and giving up the support of a close-knit community. Those who turned down transfers to GM plants in other states lost their income, pensions, and benefits. *The Last Cruze*, which sets out to amplify the voices of the auto workers in Lordstown, introduces a new chapter to Frazier's work in investigating labor, family, community, and the working class. Exhibited at the Renaissance Society in 2019, this body of work includes over sixty photographs, alongside the written stories of the workers, and was staged within an installation that echoes the structure of the plant's assembly line. This substantial catalogue includes extensive documentation of the work and introduces new essays and dialogues by contributors including Coco Fusco, David Harvey, Werner Lange, Lynn Nottage, Julia Reichert, Benjamin Young, and members of the local chapter of the United Auto Workers.

Spermatozoa are highly specialised cells. Because reproduction ultimately depends on the ability of spermatozoa to fertilise ova, these cells have been under intense selective pressures leading to the evolution of an outstanding diversity of shapes, functions and behaviours. The

widespread occurrence of sperm competition has also favoured specific adaptations designed to outcompete rival sperm. To achieve fertilisation spermatozoa face many hurdles. They have to actively reach the ovum by means of their motility and the regulation of the energy required to fuel it. Sperm cells need to interact with the ovum by exchanging appropriate recognition and activating signals and then have to penetrate the ovum vestments and deliver its DNA successfully. This multiplicity of tasks makes the spermatozoon unique among cells. Understanding mechanisms underlying sperm formation and function represents a formidable challenge which has required the development of sophisticated methods that are gradually revealing a fascinating picture. The knowledge gained by the study of spermatozoa has allowed the manipulation of reproduction to an extent which was unforeseen some years ago. Assisted reproductive techniques are presently used to overcome fertility problems in human patients, to avoid inbreeding and enhance reproduction among endangered species, and to maximise efficiency in domestic animals.

In the years between the Indian Mutiny and Independence in 1947 the Indian Civil Service was the most powerful body of officials in the English-speaking world. About 300,000,000 Indians, a sixth of the human race, were ruled by 1000 Civilians. With Whitehall 8000 miles away and the peasantry content with their decisions, they had the freedom to translate ideas into action. This work explores the use they made of their power by examining the beliefs of two middle-ranking Civilians. It shows, in detail, how they put into practice values which they acquired from their parents, their teachers and contemporary currents of opinion. F.L. Brayne and Sir Malcolm Darling reflected the two faces of British imperialism: the urge to assimilate and the desire for rapprochement. Brayne, a born-again Evangelical, despised Indian culture, thought individual Indians were sunk in sin and dedicated his career to making his peasant subjects industrious and thrifty. Darling, a cultivated humanist, despised his compatriots and thought that Indians were sensitive and imaginative. Brayne and Darling personified two ideologies that pervaded the ICS and shaped British rule in India. This work aims to make a contribution to the history of British India and a telling commentary on contemporary values at home.
