Partridge Publishing Military service members are frequently referred to as heroes by the civilian

population as it is assumed they have performed heroic acts while serving their country; however, the denial of a heroic act creates a conflict of stories between the hero, the witnesses, and the public, which leaves room for interpretation of whether the action qualifies as heroic. Despite the clear collective knowledge of heroes, in academic literature and in popular culture, there is little consensus on

how to define heroism and who qualifies as a hero (Ashley & Brown, 2015; Chinkin & Kaldor, 2013; Lash, 1995). Through a mixed methods design known as group concept mapping (Kane & Rosas, 2018), a visual framework was constructed to conceptualize and delineate aspects of the civilian perception of military veterans' heroism. Group concept mapping organizes data through multidimensional scaling and hierarchical cluster analysis, which produces a

visual representation of expressed thoughts and the connections between them, and provides structure for identifying contributing factors within complex and undefined concepts, such as heroism. The resulting concept map consisted of eight clusters, including (a) Community; (b) Only those who have been there; (c) Training; (d) Psychological pain; (e) Higher purpose; (f) Mental health struggles (g) Positive traits; and (h)

Stereotypes. Overall, the themes of demonstrating heroic characteristics and the journey to becoming a hero are the keys to understanding the results of the concept map. Light in My Cat's Eye

As General MacArthur sailed away from the Philippines vowing to return, he left behind him many American soldiers that had been swept up by the victorious Japanese tide of invasion. One such man was Lt.-Colonel

William Edwin 'Ed' Dyess, he and his unit of the 21st Pursuit Squadron flew their obsolete P-40 Warhawks against the superior Japanese fighters until no more planes remained. Undaunted he fought on as an infantryman before his eventual capture by the Japanese his deeds of selfless bravery were legendary, including giving his own plane to a fellow aviator so he could fly to safety. Dyess and his brave men deserved a better fate than that which awaited them at the hands of their Japanese captors on the infamous Bataan Death March. Driven north from Bataan, the American and Philippino prisoners were beaten, starved and prodded at the tip of the bayonet toward prison camps that had been callously unprovided with the basic means of existence. In the only successful mass prison escape, Dyess along with his men broke out of their prison camp and made contact with resistance groups. After a time waging further Guerilla operations, Dyess and two other American servicemen were evacuated by submarine to Australia. As

Dyess recuperated the American Government knowing the effect that the truth of the atrocities committed by the Japanese would galvanize public opinion allowed the release of his story via the Chicago Tribune. The story created a huge storm of outrage directed at the Japanese and of respect and admiration for Dyess and his fellow

soldiers who had endured so much on their behalf. Dyess returned to active service as soon as was possible but tragically died in an airplane accident in 1943, a hero to his men and country.
