An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading. This guide activates students prior knowledge. Anticipation

guides stimulate students' interest in a topic and set a purpose for reading.

Anticipation Guide - Reading Strategies & Misconceptions

Example 1. Sarah Dennis-Shaw has a great strategy for using anticipation guides in the classroom. Though she uses it with the book *Teammates*, to teach her students how to use anticipation guides, any teacher can use these steps and a blank template to bring anticipation guides into their own classroom.

statements about the passage are read to the students.

Anticipation Guides - Comprehension Strategies For Any ...

An anticipation guide is a specific prediction, or pre-reading, strategy that asks students to provide an opinion about big ideas or themes that are present in the text (Beers, 2003). After reading, students return to the same statements and identify whether they agree or disagree with that statement.
