AP Psychology Chapter 14 Vocab – Psychology Disorders Definition: An anxiety disorder in which a person is continually tense, apprehensive, and in a state of autonomic nervous system arousal Example: He would find himself always tense and nervous at random moments in random places ever since he was 12.

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53.behavioral psychology: the scientific study of observable behavior, and its explanation by principles of learning. 54.behaviorism: the view that psychology (1) should be an objective science that (2) studies behavior without reference to mental processes. Most research psychologists today agree with (1) but not with (2).
