APA: how to cite an online magazine article [Update 2020 ...

If an online journal article does not have a DOI assigned, APA requires the use of a URL. The general format of a reference to an online journal article with one or more authors and a URL is: If the article was found online include the URL of the journal home page only, not the full article URL and not the name of the database.

Note: All citations should be double spaced and have a hanging indent in a Reference List. A "hanging indent" means that each subsequent line after the first line of your citation should be indented by 0.5 inches. Below is a link to an APA sample paper that contains instructions about how to format a hanging indent in a paper. FREE APA Citation Generator & Format | Cite This For Me You could do a Google search for the journal title (within double quotation marks), e.g. "new zealand management magazine" to find the journal's homepage. Or, go to the Library database Ulrichsweb, search by the journal title or the journal's ISSN to find the journal record. On the journal record page, find the journal URL for your reference.

Numbers in parentheses refer to specific pages in the APA 6th Edition manual. If a Digital Object Identifier (DOI) is listed on either a print or an electronic source it is included in the reference (pp.188-192). A DOI is a unique alphanumeric string that is used to identify a certain source (typically journal articles).

Sixth edition of the APA Publication Manual. A note about online sources: The APA 6th edition requires a Digital Object Identifier (DOI) or the home page URL for articles from a database. If you find an article on the "open web" (that is, you found it using a search engine such as Google), you need the full URL of the article.

### **Journal article - APA 6th referencing style - Library ...**

Journal or magazine article (from library database or online) with no author. Proper Bibliographic Reference Format: Bibliographic references are double-spaced and indented half an inch after the first line. If there is no author, the article title comes first. For titles of journals or magazines, use italics and "headline" style capitalization.

The APA citation style (6th Edition) ... If you use an online journal as a source, then you should first look for a DOI, or digital object identifier, and use that instead of a URL. A DOI is a more precise way to locate an article than a URL because the DOI will follow the article even if the URL changes.

Journal article with DOI – available in advance in an online publication (no volume, issue or pages) Elements of the reference Author(s) of journal article – family name and initials, use & for multiple authors.
