Such substances are usually poor conductors of electricity due to the fact that they do not readily dissociate into ions in their melt state or in their dissolved state.

(a) Pure water or an aqueous solution of a nonelectrolyte allows almost no current to flow, and the bulb does not light.

(c) A strong electrolyte produces many ions, allowing more current to flow and the bulb to shine brightly.
