Sylvia Plath (/ p l æ /; October 27, 1932 – February 11, 1963) was an American poet, novelist, and short-story writer. She is credited with advancing the genre of confessional poetry and is best known for two of her published collections, *The Colossus and Other Poems* and *Ariel*, as well as *The Bell Jar*, a semi-autobiographical novel published shortly before

her death.

The poem is filled with the skillful application of consonance (rhyming consonants) and assonance (rhyming vowels), as well as a end, slant (or half rhymes), and head rhymes (also called alliteration).
