He entered the fur trade and built a monopoly, managing a business empire that extended to the Great Lakes region and Canada ...

In 1810, two years after the Lewis and Clark expedition crossed the American continent, wealthy fur merchant John Jacob Astor financed an overland and overseas expedition to build the equivalent of a Jamestown settlement on the Pacific Coast.
