work; and in school newspapers, students have a voice--responsible articles and editorials can impact their lives in school. The book also gives suggestions for layout and design, photography, generating--and funding--the newspaper, and a budget worksheet. While most people will never be charged with a serious crime, either you or someone you know has appeared in a Municipal Court.
