Brian Jones life was a David vs. Goliath. Young, petite, and naïve, his Goliath was the Rolling Stones money machine. Unlike the Bible, Brian lost his life. This book levels the battlefield by telling what happened to the band's founder.

After a fight over musical direction Brian left the band planning to start anew and take the Rolling Stones name with him. Three weeks later he
