Like "Battery," it explores the innocent cruelty of boys toward cats—a cruelty that is mitigated by the linguistic weave and verbal play in which it is embedded. "The Obelisk" explores one boy's nascent eroticism that is caught between cultural expectations of conformity and foreign temptations.
