farmer who worked the same land
as her slave ancestors, yet her
cells—taken without her
knowledge—became one of the

The first “immortal” human cells

scientists investigating HeLa
began using her husband and
children in research without
informed consent. And though the
cells had launched a multimillion-
dollar industry that sells human
biological materials, her family
