personal inquiry into the catastrophe provides a great deal of insight into what went wrong. But for Krakauer himself, further interviews and investig ations only lead him to t.he conclusion that his perceived failures were directly responsible for a fellow climber's death.

Clearly, Krakauer remains haunted by the disaster. and although he relates a number of which he acted selflessly and even heroically, he seems unable to view those instances objectively. In the end, despite his evenhanded and even generous assessment of others' actions, he

reserves a full measure of vitriol for himself. This updated trade paperback edition of Into Thin incidents in Air includes an extensive new postscript that sheds fascinating light on the acrimonious debate that flared between Krakauer and Everest quide Anatoli Boukreev in the wake of the tragedy. "I have no

doubt that Boukreev's intentions were good on summit day," writes Krakauer in the postscript, dated August 1999. "What disturbs me, though, was Boukreev's refusal to acknowledge the possibility that he made even a single poor decision. Never did he indicate that perhaps it wasn't the best choice to
