While finding that many of these works may be read as gendered and feminized, Chang emphasizes that the Jesuits ' depiction of China as a country of high culture and in perennial conflict with the Tartars gradually lost prominence in dramatic imaginations to depictions of China ' s material and visual attractions. Central to the book ' s argument is that the stage representations of China were inherently intercultural and open to new influences, manifested by the evolving combinations of Chinese and English (British) traits. Through the dramatization of the Chinese Other, the representations questioned, satirized, and put in

sharp relief the ontological and epistemological bases of the English (British) Self.

Neuroendocrinology, Volume II, is the second in a two-volume treatise designed to provide a survey of all aspects of the rapidly expanding science of neuroendocrinology.
