Church Nursery Volunteer Guidelines

Nursery Coordinator must arrive 15 minutes before the nursery opens (8:45 am on Sundays): 1. Set up folding gate between nursery and Sunday School room. 2. Set up welcome station: put out sign-in/sign-out sheet, pen, labels, nursery binder. 3. Nursery staff and volunteers must wear a name tag to make it easier for new parents to get to know your name.

Nursery Volunteers: Please arrive at the nursery 15 minutes before your scheduled service. If you cannot serve during your scheduled service, please contact one of the other volunteers on the schedule (a copy should be e-mailed or mailed to you each quarter) and arrange a swap with another volunteer. Teaching Tips for Your Volunteers in the Church Nursery

Be sure to follow state and municipal guidelines for daycares and churches in your area. Take care of vulnerable volunteers. Many local churches will multiply the number of services they offer in order to accommodate everyone while still practicing social isolation. The potential danger of this approach is putting key volunteers and staff at a greater risk of infection.

If you are paged, please come to the nursery, this means that the volunteers feel that your help with your child is warranted. You will be paged: If a child is crying inconsolably for an extended period of time. If the child is injured and the volunteer feels it is something the parent should be involved with, urgently.

Always Looking for Church Nursery Volunteers? - American ...

Report to the nursery 10 minutes prior to their scheduled service. The only exception is Sunday School hour and then it is 5 minutes prior.

Store any personal items out of reach of children (including cell phones) Wash hands in preparation to receive and care for the children. Put on Nursery Volunteer Nametag.

Promote healthy hygiene practices. Encourage staff and congregants to maintain good hand hygiene, washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Ensure you have accessible sinks and enough supplies for people to clean their hands and cover their coughs and sneezes.
