The increased authority of the

Gregory VII hoped to lead an

defeat by the Seljuq Turks at  
Manzikert (present Malazgirt,  
Turkey) in 1071.

The crusades have a big affect in  
the church. The failure of  
crusades led to the lessen power  
of the pope. They lessened the  
power of feudal nobility and  
increased power of the kings. The

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crusades grew out of religious fervor along with fever, feudalism and chivalry and this led to growth of trade towns and universities.

Church Reform And The Crusades

Rulers and the Church favored the Crusades because they sent warlike knights out of their lands. Common people joined the Crusades out of deep religious feeling. The First Crusade, begun in 1096, was badly organized. Yet the Crusaders still captured some of the Holy Land, including Jerusalem.

They converted but were still tried for heresy and burned at the stake. What were the effects of the crusades? Increased trading between Europe and Southwest Asia, role of women expanded to run estates or businesses after men left for war, power of pope lessened, power of feudal lords lessened and power of kings increased, persecution of muslims and

jews caused legacy of hatred and bitterness, energy of crusades also led to expansion of trade and towns and universities across medieval Europe.

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Religious life assumed new forms or reformed established ones, and missionaries expanded the geographic boundaries of the faith. The most dramatic example of this missionary activity was the effort to retake the Holy Land by force during the Crusades, but less-violent missions were undertaken in pagan Europe and in the Islamic world.
