The increased authority of the papacy and the relative decline in the power of the emperor became clear in the unforeseen emergence of the Crusades as a major preoccupation of Europe. Gregory VII hoped to lead an army to defend Eastern Christians after their disastrous defeat by the Seljuq Turks at

Manzikert (present Malazgirt, Turkey) in 1071.

Church Reform & the Crusades Wkst- Teacher

Religious life assumed new forms or reformed established ones, and missionaries expanded the geographic boundaries of the faith. The most dramatic example of this missionary activity was the effort to retake the Holy Land by force during the Crusades, but less-violent missions were undertaken in pagan Europe and in the Islamic world.

burned at the stake. What were the effects of the crusades? Increased trading between Europe and Southwest Asia, role of women expanded to run estates or businesses after men left for war, power of pope lessened, power of feudal lords lessened and power of kings increased, persecution of muslims and jews caused legacy of hatred and bitterness, energy of crusades also led to expansion of trade and towns and universities across medieval Europe.
