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Answers to the Exercise in Identifying Sentences by Function

Well, the usual sentence classifications are simple sentences, compound sentences, complex sentences, and compound-complex sentences. Simple sentences are the most basic kind, they consist of one independent clause. Compound sentences contain two independent clauses.

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This guide includes instructional pages on grammar. A complex sentence contains at least one independent clause and at least one dependent clause. Dependent clauses can refer to the subject (who, which) the sequence/time (since, while), or the causal elements (because, if) of the independent clause. If a sentence begins with a dependent clause, note the comma after this clause.

Imperative sentences give order or instructions. The classification of a sentence based on structure is a little more in-depth. Structure involves simple sentences, compound sentences, and complex sentences. Simple sentences only have one independent clause. Compound sentences have at least two independent clauses.

Types of Sentences According to Structure with Examples ...

Listen to the definition for a Pattern 1 sentence. The pattern of a sentence is the order of the main parts of the sentence. Pattern 1 has only two main parts: the subject and the verb. Adjectives and adverbs add information to sentences, but they are not part of a sentence pattern.
