Sometimes I started by saying “ Everything is famous if you notice it. Sure, here ’ s my answer. ” I think the poem has served me well. My biggest surprise has been, everyone always wants me to read this poem. I guess it is one of my three most often-requested poems. Teachers always mention it. Parents have told me they copy it on graduation cards for their high school seniors. I ’ ve seen it hand-printed on posters in many classrooms. Students participating in UIL public speaking competitions often recite it. It ’ s been printed on more than one standardized test. I allow it to be printed because I like to imagine students can have friendly moments even while taking ominous tests.
