After his return from New York and Cuba to Republican Spain in 1930, he devoted himself to the

theatre, writing three tragedies including *Blood Wedding* (1933). An outspoken supporter of the Republic, he was assassinated at the height of his fame by Nationalist partisans in Granada in 1936, on the eve of the Spanish Civil War.
