The Tenth Circuit ruled that an officer 's 15-minute phone call to a national database was reasonable and did not impermissibly extend a traffic stop. The Seventh Circuit said that the smell of marijuana combined with a driver 's "shocked" body language justified a trunk search. The Fourth Circuit tossed a man's gun convictions after the officers arrested the man at his girlfriend's residence without probable cause that he lived there.
