The Official History of Criminal Justice in England and Wales SAGE Multicultural aspects of psychology have received some attention in the literature in the last decade. A number of texts currently address these significant concerns, for example, *Counseling the Culturally Different* (Sue & Sue, 2008); *Handbook of Multicultural Counseling* (Poterotto et al., 2009); and *Handbook of Multicultural Counseling Competencies* (Pope-Davis & Coleman, 2005).
