High-quality CPR at a rate of 100-120 chest compressions per minute must be started immediately to keep oxygenated blood flowing to their brain. However, when someone experiences sudden cardiac arrest, the only thing that will set their heart back into a normal rhythm is the shock from a defibrillator.

Tips for Proper CPR Technique in Adults

Give two breaths after every 30 chest compressions. If two people are conducting CPR, give two breaths after every 15 chest compressions. Perform CPR for about two minutes before calling for help unless someone else can make the call while you attend to the infant. Continue CPR until you see signs of life or until
