Certain topics are discussed in depth either because of their clinical importance or because recent data have become available concerning pathophysiology or treatment. A similar style has been adopted with recently introduced drugs, where little is known about the effects in overdose. The value of certain chapters, especially those on poisonous plants and snake bites, has been enhanced by the inclusion of a large number of colour photographs.
