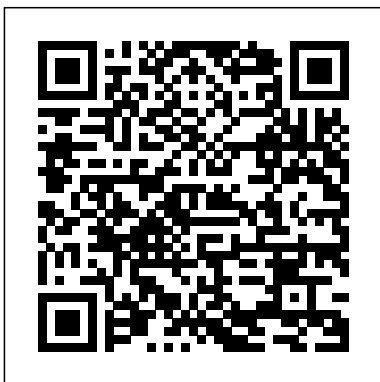

In hospice you NEVER say the patient is improving (but you can say "patient states i'm having a good day.") In the hospital setting, negative charting meant
