Results. Of 8,669 decedents, there was an average 13.8-point decline in PPS scores. After adjusting for baseline PPS scores and length of stay in hospice, three distinct trajectories were identified, each of which was composed of two diagnoses whose rates of decline had 95% confidence intervals that

overlapped.

Patients that have ceased to show on-going decline or who have plateaued from a trajectory of decline may no longer meet hospice eligibility guidelines despite a significant need for custodial care.

Suggestions for documentation. Obtain and document the patient ' s weight (when possible).

Decline in Karnofsky Performance Status (KPS) or Palliative Performance Score (PPS) from <70% due to progression of disease. Increasing emergency room visits, hospitalizations, or physician's visits related to hospice primary diagnosis; Progressive decline in Functional Assessment Staging (FAST) for dementia (from 7A on the FAST)

In hospice you NEVER say the patient is improving (but you can say "patient states i'm having a good day.") In the hospital setting, negative charting meant that in your narrative, you would only document a deviation from normal. Document Evidence of Decline for Related Diagnoses: Documentation must communicate evidence of decline by focusing on problems the patient/caregiver is having. Assess all body systems and treat the patient holistically

The patient ' s diagnosis is known to you, so look for decline and document it. Often the tendency is to try to highlight the positives, but in hospice it ' s best to highlight the negatives. Your documentation makes a difference and can help keep a patient on service.
