When a nurse is admi#ing any hospice patient, it is also good to document what the patient was doing 3 and 6 months ago as compared to what the patient is able to do now. Results. Of 8,669 decedents, there was an average 13.8-point decline in PPS scores. After adjusting for baseline PPS scores and length of stay in hospice, three distinct trajectories were identified, each of which was composed of two diagnoses whose rates of decline had 95% confidence intervals that overlapped.
