discovers uncanny echoes of the eighteenth-century language of the closet in twenty-first-century coming-out narratives. Featuring more than thirty illustrations, *The Closet* offers a richly detailed and compelling account of an eighteenth-century setting and symbol of intimacy that continues to resonate today.
