particular. He relates the horrific violence of the Troubles

in Northern Ireland, which led most Irish to reject violent

lodestar, from John F. Kennedy's 1963 visit, when the

soon-to-be martyred American president was welcomed

as a native son, to the emergence of the Irish technology

sector in the late 1990s, driven by American corporations,

which set Ireland on the path toward particular disaster
