Not in the sense of aesthetic frippery but in the sense of aesthetic craftsmanship; otherwise I will feel my loneliness continually . . . I do not want to be lonely all my

life but people only make us lonelier by reminding us of God. Dear God please help me to be an artist, please let it lead to You."
