The *Nonopioid Analgesics* chapter groups together non-opioid analgesics, nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs, and antirheumatic and antigout drugs, making these easier to locate and study. Coverage of the endocrine system includes four separate chapters for the most comprehensive coverage. *Drug Interactions in Clinical Dentistry* appendix lists potential interactions between drugs a patient is taking for nondental

conditions and drugs that may be used or prescribed during dental treatment, including effects and recommendations. Glossary of Abbreviations appendix includes the most common abbreviations used for drugs or conditions. New Pharmacogenetics and Pharmacogenomics chapter covers the effects of genetic traits of patients on their responses to drugs.
