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Wild-food advocate Jo Robinson, writing for The New York Times, says that wild dandelion greens have more than seven times the phytonutrients found in grocery-store spinach. A chart in the same article shows that certain edible crab apples have anywhere from 2 to 100 times the phytonutrients found in common apple varieties.

1. Burdock (*Arctium lappa*) This plant is easy to spot if you look for the annoying burrs. When those aren't present, look for a rosette of oblong, pointed leaves with no stem that grow close to the ground in the first year. Edible parts: The leaves are edible, but older leaves are tough and taste better when cooked.

### Foraging Texas

Purslane (*Portulaca oleracea*) aboveground parts  
and nettle (*Urtica dioica*) leaf, young stalk, and seed  
are two wild edible foods that contain notable levels  
of potassium. Iron is essential for the creation of  
hemoglobin, which carries oxygen to red blood  
cells, as well as amino acids, hormones,  
neurotransmitters, and collagen (HMS, 2018).
