The MASCC guidelines suggest the use of a soft manual toothbrush. In a healthy population, powered toothbrushes have reported benefits in plaque removal and gingivitis reduction. It is unknown whether the use of an powered toothbrush has similar benefits in patients with OM. **Objective** To compare a manual and an powered toothbrush (MT and PT) when used by patients undergoing ASCT, regarding patients compliance, severity of OM and the removal of plaque. **Methods** A RCT with two groups (n=23 MT, n=23 PT) was conducted in ASCT patients. During the hospitalization period, patient compliance plaque and OM were scored daily. **Results** There was no difference in patient compliance between both groups. Patients complied to the protocol to brush their teeth, but did not brush 4 times a day as recommended.
