Relapse prevention helps participants maintain their gains and prepare for future winter seasons. A chapter on group logistics and an appendix with fidelity checklists will assist clinicians in successfully implementing the program. The obesity epidemic is one of the most serious public health threats confronting the nation and the world.
