Exchange 2013 also comes in two client access license (CAL) editions, which are referred to as a Standard CAL and an Enterprise CAL. You can mix and match the server editions with the CAL types. For example, you can use Enterprise CALs with Exchange 2013 Standard Edition.

Client access to Exchange Server 2013 is licensed with two different Client Access Licenses (CALs), a Standard CAL (SCAL) and an Enterprise CAL (ECAL). The SCAL is always

required and the ECAL is additive, meaning accessing the full Exchange Server 2013 feature set requires the ECAL in addition to the SCAL.
