Abstract: Abstract Despite the fact that many studies have confirmed the connection between mental illness and patients' family systems and have called for systemic intervention, the development of couple and family therapy practice in Taiwan remains limited. To promote local family therapy practice, this thesis begins with a review of 68 family therapy studies published in Taiwan during 1992-2004, and further analyzes 11 case studies, noticing that the perceptual level of work in therapy interviews may have not been sufficient in the local common practice. To illuminate the significance of perceiving and incorporating data of perceptual nuances in the therapy interview process, this thesis examines the process of an experienced therapist's interview with Taiwan families. Eight therapy interviews are carefully examined with qualitative approach, upon which a framework is proposed, designated as

"therapeutic movement," to provide a lens for psychotherapists to sharpen their sense of progress when interviewing family. Four aspects of interview process are highlighted in this framework: (1) Critical subject matters therapist chooses to explore further, (2) Response of the family indicating the progress of the interview, (3) Intervention maneuver of the therapist, and (4) Thinking underlying the intervention. To illustrate the intricate process in which therapeutic movements are established in specific clinical contexts, the eight interview sessions are presented in detail. The thesis ends with a discussion on features of Taiwan families' responses in therapy, and some cultural considerations with regard to the therapist's intervention when working with local families.
