The 2019 Poverty Guidelines, commonly referred to as the Federal Poverty Level or FPL, follow in the tables below. Note that these amounts change based on the number of individuals in the household and the state in which one resides. Federal Poverty Levels are used by many assistance programs as a way to set eligibility criteria.

The charts below set forth the annual, monthly and weekly 2019 Federal Poverty Guidelines (based on HHS thresholds). In addition, the annual, monthly and weekly 115% of poverty, 125% of poverty, 187.5%, 200% of poverty and 300% of poverty amounts are listed.

If your income falls below 138% of the federal poverty guidelines, with your state's expanded Medicaid program, you should qualify based on your projected income. With an income between 100% and 400% of the FPL, you qualify for tax credits applied to lower your monthly premium when enrolling in a Marketplace health insurance plan.

Non-Federal organizations that use the poverty guidelines under their own authority in non-Federally-funded activities also may choose to use a percentage multiple of the guidelines. The poverty guidelines do not make a distinction between farm and non-farm families, or between

aged and non-aged units.
