Federal Sentencing Guidelines. Prior to the 1980s, the federal courts used an indeterminate sentencing system, which allowed trial judges to impose sentences entirely at their discretion. Research, however, revealed that this system created sentencing disparities in which different criminals received very different sentences for the same crime.

### Federal Sentencing Guidelines

In the United States, the Federal Sentencing Guidelines is the scheme most often used to punish people convicted of federal crimes. However, that has not always been the case. The guidelines were first adopted in 1987. Before then it was mostly up to each individual judge to decide how to punish criminals convicted in the judge's court.

The Federal Sentencing Guidelines also allow judges to deviate from the suggested sentence in particular cases. The sentencing table lists sentences in four different zones: A, B, C, and D. People who fall into Zone A can be given probation without having to serve any time in prison.

"Declared, That it is the sense of the Senate that in the two years preceding the enactment of the sentencing guidelines, Federal judges, in determining the particular sentence to be imposed, consider— "(1) the nature and circumstances of the offense and the history and characteristics of the defendant;
