evident in the above quotation from Stadler's 1954 paper, "The gene". Early observations on the constancy of the cytological appearance of chromosomes and their regular behaviour in cell division led to speculation on their biological importance. As genetics became more refined in the early decades of the 20th century the genes-on-a-string model of chromosomes developed and greater emphasis was placed on the further dissection of these structures. As a result, in the 1980's the reductionist approach is reaching a crest as extensive regions of the genetic material are being sequenced.
