Peter Schubert, Franz's father, a teacher by profession, was an amateur cellist and had taught his son the rudiments of music. However, the youngster proved a bit more of a talent

than his father and was soon taken to the Imperial Seminary by Salieri (of Mozart fame) where he sung in the choir, played the violin and was taught theory.
