In United States history, a free Negro or free black was the legal status, in the geographic area of the United States, of African Americans who were not slaves. It included both freed slaves and those who had been born free. This term was also in use during the colonial period of the United States, and lasted until the abolition of slavery in the United States in December 1865, which rendered the term unnecessary.

In 1860, slave owners, white or black, owned around one to five slaves on average. About 28 percent of the free black population in or more. C. Richards and her son P.C. go above and beyond these other six slave owners by owning over twice as many.

Moreover, runaway slaves constantly swelled the ranks of freedmen. Free blacks were slaveowners for more than two hundred years. 3 Black owners obtained slaves by inheritance through white and black relatives and by gifts and purchase. Many blacks had been ac customed to slavery in Africa.
