mapping; and have been bought and

Henrietta's family did not learn of  
her "immortality" until more than  
twenty years after her death, when  
scientists investigating HeLa began  
using her husband and children in

research without informed consent. And though the cells had launched a multimillion-dollar industry that sells human biological materials, her family never saw any of the profits.
