It is therefore a graphic novel meaning that it is a narrative with occasional pictures with a dominance of verbal elements. However, there are still five actual comics in the book. Mont è s reminds us of the period in which they came about, “ an era of pioneer and idealized territorial vision, ” coupled with a still-evolving American citizenry and democracy.
