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The British Thoracic Society (BTS) first produced a guideline on asthma and its management in 1990. The first collaborative guideline with the Scottish Intercollegiate Guideline Network (SIGN) using evidence-based medicine methodology was published in 2003.1 It has since become a mainstay of asthma management across the UK and beyond with updates published regularly every 18 – 24 months.
