It seemed to me that many of these uses of argumentation were inspired by (of ten inspired) guesswork, and that a great majority of the AI community were unaware that there was a maturing, rich field of research in *Argumentation Theory* (and *Critical Thinking and Informal Logic*) that had been steadily rebuilding a scholarly approach to the area over the previous

twenty years or so.

Argumentation Theory, on its side; was developing theories and approaches that many in the field felt could have a role more widely in research and society, but were for the most part unaware that AI was one of the best candidates for such application.

The volume offers a great deal of diversity in its breadth of coverage of argumentation theory and wide geographic representation from North and South America to Europe and China.
